After his service in the Navy, Jason committed himself to becoming an accredited mental and physical health professional. He established Cadence Wellness, which provides clients access to evidence-based and holistic practices. Jason has made a tremendous impact on many individuals in his community by utilizing contrast therapy, sound healing, meditation, trauma-informed practices, and other proven tactics to help individuals improve their overall well-being. Jason uses a service dog daily, and as an Ambassador to Sierra Delta, he has helped many fellow veterans gain access to education and support provided by Sierra Delta's Life Buddy Program. The Life Buddy Program allows veterans to access education and grants to work with local and regional dog trainers to build and execute a dog training plan best suited to the individual veteran's needs and lifestyle.

Jason's holistic and creative approach to wellness and exceptional leadership skills have been a force multiplier for Sierra Delta and our mission to support more veterans in building a life-changing bond with their dog through healthy training and routines within the Life Buddy Program. Jason also utilizes his growing support network to bring awareness and financial support to Sierra Delta's mission to create more opportunities to access professional dog training for more veterans. Jason's leadership in the Sierra Delta community has helped many veterans in the northeast and beyond understand and find the programs and practices that help them begin their journey towards living a healthier life through the love of dogs and through focusing on the wellness practices that best meet their needs and lifestyle. A COMMUNITY RISES: SHARE THE GOOD WORK IN UGANDA

One of the most powerful moments from a recent two-week trip to Uganda was the time spent with the Niye Women Cooperative Society in Alebtong District—home to the Leyi Naa piggery project, funded last fall by a \$7,500 grant from Share the Good. What unfolded was more than just a project update—it was a deeply



moving celebration of hope, faith, and transformation. Over 40 village members, their children, and local leaders gathered for a joyous ceremony, complete with singing, prayers, and even a stilt-walking dancer. During the event, the project was officially commissioned and handed over to the community. The villagers have taken ownership with great care, establishing elected officials and security measures to protect and sustain the effort.



This community has partnered with Field of Hope since 2015 and has faithfully applied agricultural training to improve their farms and livelihoods. With the new piggery and their first-ever clean water source just 250 yards away, their future looks brighter than ever. No longer will they walk kilometers for contaminated water—this borehole will serve both the pigs and the people, reducing disease and supporting sustainability. They've dedicated a section of land to grow maize for feed, and after several months of training, they're equipped to succeed. Within two years, most families in the village are expected to raise their own pigs—bringing not just food, but a reliable income and renewed dignity. Share the Good is honored to be part of this story, and we invite you to pray for the continued success of this remarkable project and the faithful women leading it.

FAQ's

Q. Why should I donate through the STG Foundation?

A. Frequently individuals are pressured after giving by receiving mailings, emails, phone calls, etc. When you give through the STG Foundation, we will allocate the money, making you anonymous in giving to the organizations. STG will regularly report the return on your investments by highlighting the successes of the organizations we are supporting. STG allocates 95% of all donations to the actual causes we are supporting. Additionally, we have a stringent process of vetting organizations to be sure they are financially accountable and highly effective before lending support. We require regular updates from each organization and are in regular communication. We feel this differentiates us as our donors can be confident their monies are going directly to the need with maximized results.

Q. What is the easiest way for me to give?

A. The easiest way to donate is by visiting our website www.stgfoundation.org and clicking on the "Donate" button, which will direct you to our giving baskets page. In this page you can find your cause and allocate how you would like your contribution to be distributed.

Q. If I am unable to give financially at this time, what are some other ways I can make a difference?

A. First and foremost, you can pray for us and those who are impacted through our giving. Secondly, you can SHARE SHARE SHARE! While you personally may not be able to give financially, you likely have those in your circle who can. While the mission of STG Foundation has been in motion for decades, the foundation itself is just now starting to grow and expand its audience. By helping us expand our reputation, you are making a difference and helping with our overall mission to impact our communities and our world. Lastly, if you are able to give of your time to represent the foundation and assist any of our partner charities, they can all use volunteers on any given day. We believe that everyone, no matter what obstacles we face, can Share The Good!

Q. Can you receive gifts from donor advisor funds (DAF)?

A. Yes! The STG Foundation is able to receive gifts from donor advisor funds.

Q. Can I donate funds from my IRA?

A. Yes, if you are age 70 ½ or older, you can donate your IRA directly to charity completely tax free! Can I donate assets other than cash? Yes, you can donate appreciated securities like stocks, mutual funds and ETF's, and you receive the full fair market value as a tax deduction yet neither you or the charity pay capital gains taxes!

Q. How do I know the organizations my donations are going to are legit?

A. Each charity is vetted with pre-determined criteria to ensure that the vast majority of the money given directly impacts the cause. The STG Foundation will ensure your donation delivers a real and meaningful impact. Most of the organizations, whenever possible, are vetted through in-person visits from STG board members, which allows us to maintain personal relationships with each organization as well.
